Pre-Departure Helpful Information

Before you depart on your trip, we encourage the following:

- Enroll in the Smart Traveler Enrollment Program for safety updates while abroad.
- Reconfirm flight times and check-in online 24 hours before departure.
- Call your credit card and mobile phone companies and let them know when & where you will be traveling. Consider purchasing an international phone plan (your mobile phone service provider can add to your base plan for the duration of your trip).
- Make a printed copy of all your passports and use those for hotel check ins. Leave another copy at home with family member or a friend.
- Take pictures of your passport photo page and COVID vaccination card with your smart phone. In the event your physical versions and copies are lost or stolen, you will have a digital copy.
- Pack all important items, including medication, in a carry-on bag (NOT your checked bag) along with a change of clothes and travel-sized toiletries in case your bags are delayed. A small rollaboard suitcase works well for 2-4 travelers.
- Download our recommended apps, including Axus, Whats App and Maps.me and Google Translate.
- Arrive at the airport at least two hours prior to your departure for domestic flights and 3 hours for international flights.

Travel Documents to Bring With You:

- Printed copy of your itinerary and a downloaded version to your smartphone via the AXUS app.
- Printed copy of all your vouchers and confirmations (some suppliers will not accept electronic copies)
- Passports* & Original COVID Vaccination Cards
- Printed copies of passports and vaccination cards
- International Driver's License (if self-driving)

Use FaceTime Audio or WhatsApp for International Calls

• You can use FaceTime Audio or WhatsApp to make calls over WiFi without incurring international call charges.

Data & Roaming On Your Mobile Device (if you didn't purchase an international data plan)

• While traveling, you may want to turn off your cellular data and cellular roaming on your phone, so you don't incur expensive international charges. An easy way to do this is to put your phone into airplane mode and then manually turn WiFi back on.



Security and Safety

- Portugal is a relatively safe country. Generally, you will want to take the same general safety precautions as you would in the U.S. and watch your wallet, handbag, phone and luggage when out in public.
- Be especially vigilant of pickpockets and purse snatchers on public transportation and around the Central Train Stations in larger cities. Always keep a hand on your purse or travel bag, especially at outdoor cafes.

If visiting Lisbon:

- Lisbon—like Portugal in general—has one of the lowest violent-crime rates in Europe. However, crime does exist, from pickpockets on the trams to purse snatchers in the street. You can walk about at night, but avoid deserted or badly lit streets. (Be especially mindful in the Bairro Alto and avoid Baixa late at night.) Keep an eye on your belongings and avoid setting them down where they can be stolen.
- Some areas on the outskirts of town can be dangerous, though there's little reason travelers would want to be there anyway. Parts of the
- Avenidas Novas might be worked by streetwalkers at night, and the Rua da Palma and lower art of the Avenida Almirante Reis can also be dicey.
- Don't tempt thieves with flashy, expensive jewelry, dangling or open purses, easily accessible wallets or unlocked cars.
 Don't leave handbags or backpacks open, and make sure your most valuable possessions are close to your body or back in the hotel safe. Hold on tightly to purses and briefcases, and avoid the side of the sidewalk nearest traffic (purse snatchers sometimes operate from the backs of motorbikes). Avoid fanny packs. They are the mark of a tourist and attract thieves.
 Keep physical contact with your belongings, even when seated at a cafe table or outdoor restaurant (for example, handbags should loop over an ankle or knee, rather than a chair back).

Tipping

- At restaurants and cafes, a service charge is usually included in the bill. Tips are therefore not expected but still appreciated. You can tip an additional 5%-10% of the total bill for exceptional service.
- Taxi drivers expect a tip of 10% of the fare.

Suggested tipping for transfers, tour guides & hotels:

- Full-day excursions: €20-40
- Half-day excursions: €10-20
- Full-day private driver: €10-30
- Transfer services: €5-10 per transfer
- Housekeeping: €1/night
- Concierge: €5-10, depending on service
- Porters and bellhops: €1/bag

- To text from overseas, we like an app called WhatsApp, which lets you message and call over WIFI without accruing SMS charges. Anyone you are messaging or calling will need to have the app as well.
- You will need a valid US driver's license to pick up your vehicle; you will also need an International Driver's License to rent a car. Most clients obtain the license at AAA offices. International Driver's License info.

TAX/VAT Reimbursement

- A value-added tax of 23% is added to the price of most goods and services. With a little paperwork, non-EU citizens can obtain a tax refund for purchases of more than 60 euros in a single store displaying a "tax-free" sticker. Refunds usually amount to about 13-16% of the purchase price.
- Make sure you get the paperwork at the store on the day of purchase. Most stores will not provide the necessary document retroactively.
- You need to present several items to the VAT refund officer at the airport before departure to get a refund: the article you purchased, the receipt, and a refund form (which must be picked up at the place of purchase), and your passport and ticket. Note that only unused articles are eligible for a refund. If everything is in order, the VAT refund officer will give you a final form to be mailed. (For your own convenience, see the VAT officer before checking your bags and have your purchases in an easy-to-reach place.)
- Some larger stores have a streamlined process: They handle most of the paperwork and then mail the refund to you, usually minus a fee.
- Private VAT refund services, located at the airport, will give you an immediate refund minus a fee, which is usually a percentage of the refund.
- If you are traveling to other countries in the European Union, you can claim your refunds only at your exit point from the EU. In other words, if you're traveling on to Spain and France and are departing the EU from Paris, you have to claim the VAT refunds from all three countries at the airport in Paris.



 bus. Thieves frequently work in pairs—one diverts your attention while another grabs your bag. Be wary of strangers
 trying to distract you while you're using an ATM.

Don't leave handbags or backpacks open, and make sure your most valuable possessions are close to your body or back in the hotel safe. Hold on tightly to purses and briefcases, and avoid the side of the sidewalk nearest traffic (purse snatchers sometimes operate from the backs of motorbikes). Avoid fanny packs. They are the mark of a tourist and attract thieves. Feel free to ask as much as you'd like, as your guide knows everything there is to know, from where the floor stones came from to all the different types of flowers to be found!

As you leave the Alcazar behind, you'll follow the winding streets into the vibrant **Barrio de Santa Cruz**, a remnant of the medieval city where many Moors and Jews once resided. See the remains of the old Moorish wall that used to surround the city and get lost in the maze of streets lined with colorful houses.

Finally, you'll arrive at the beautiful Cathedral Santa Maria de la Sede, an iconic structure that defines the Sevilla skyline. The cathedral was built over the site of the ancient mosque and is now the third-largest cathedral in the world, housing the tomb of Christopher Columbus. Say goodbye to your guide inside before climbing up the Giralda Tower for spectacular views of Sevilla.

Prepare yourself for an excursion full of breath-taking scenery and enchanting villages. You'll be met by your guide and driver in your hotel lobby this morning to begin your journey into the beautiful **Sierra de Grazalema**, taking in some of the most spectacular views in Andalucia.

Driving through olive groves, rolling meadows, cork forests, and mountainous terrain, you'll be visiting Andalucia's **White Villages**, perched atop limestone cliffs with immaculate streets, whitewashed houses, and artisanal craft and food producers.

Your first stop will be Arcos de Ia Frontera, a quaint clifftop town that acts as a gateway to the famous White Villages. Walking along the narrow streets and alleyways, you'll find the old quarter, which is full of historic gems, such as Los Duques Castle and the remains of the town wall, which still hosts many palaces and manors inside.

Your next stop lies on the other side of the Sierra de Grazalema Natural Park. Enjoy a range of amazing landscapes and views as you pass through, stopping for a short walk to the *Puerto de las Palomas*, a hilltop with impressive views over the provinces of Cadiz, Malaga, and Sevilla. Be sure to look up every now and again for a glimpse of the Griffon vultures that inhabit the park, the largest colony in Spain.

Arriving in the tiny town of **Grazalema**, enjoy a scenic walk through its cobblestoned streets and squares. You'll have lunch in the village (not included in price), followed by a visit to a local olive oil mill.

Founded in the 18th century and now one of the last hydraulic presses still working in Spain, visiting this mill will introduce you to the traditional methods of olive oil making. The owners continue fighting to maintain this old-fashioned press form and they produce a single, delicious oil, packed full of intense flavor and aroma.

Finally, you'll arrive at the legendary town of Ronda. Straddling a deep gorge, Ronda enjoys commanding views over the surrounding mountain range. The old town, perched atop a cliff, boasts charming streets lined with noble houses, museums, and quaint plazas. During your time here, you'll see the "Puente Nuevo" (New Bridge) that links the old town to the new across the gorge. You can choose to enter the Ronda bullring the oldest bullring in Spain to learn about Spain's most famous and controversial tradition. Afterward, you'll head back to Sevilla.
